	2: INITIAL STATE Go No Go <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Outdated housing needs assessment (2006) - Current information is disjointed, often inaccurate and more qualitative than quantitative - Missed potential for local funding due to lack of data - Lack of objective data over the housing spectrum that highlights gaps (by geographic, income level and population groups) leads to unaligned and siloed efforts. - Need for affordable housing far exceeds the resources - HMIS not fully implemented by all stakeholders - Z-code not fully implemented by key stakeholders 	5: SOLUTION APPROACH Go No Go <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - If we do a housing needs assessment, then we will have a better understanding how we can help improve the regional housing situation. - If we create an easy to understand analysis of our results, then we can provide a uniformed and consistent presentation for stakeholders. - If we mobilize elected officials and citizens, then we expect to generate policy changes and additional resources to address the gaps outlined in the Housing Needs Assessment. - If we are successful in influencing policy change and generate additional resources for housing, then we expect to have a healthier Central Oregon. - If we get all key stakeholders to commit to using HMIS then we can have better data which will allow us to identify gaps and tailor future programs and services - If we get all key stakeholders to utilize the z-code for tracking homeless, this will allow us to better identify gaps and tailor future programs and services 	8: CONFIRMED STATE Go No Go <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A new and current housing needs assessment is not completed. - HMIS is not fully utilized by all agencies and organizations that serve the homeless - Z codes are not fully utilized by key stakeholders
