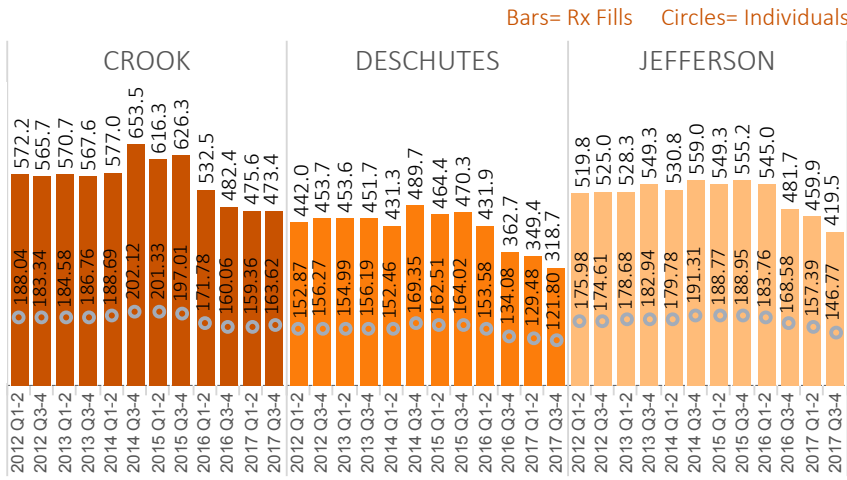
Oregon's PDMP data on opioids in Central OR Counties (2012 thru Q4 2017)

OPIOID RX RATES BY COUNTY (per 1,000 residents)



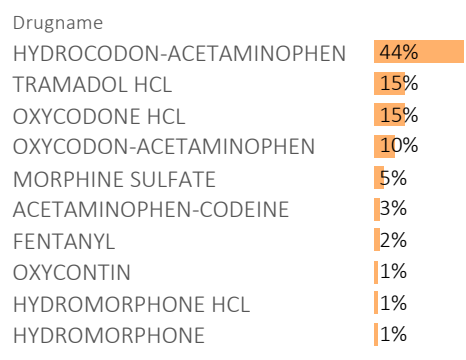

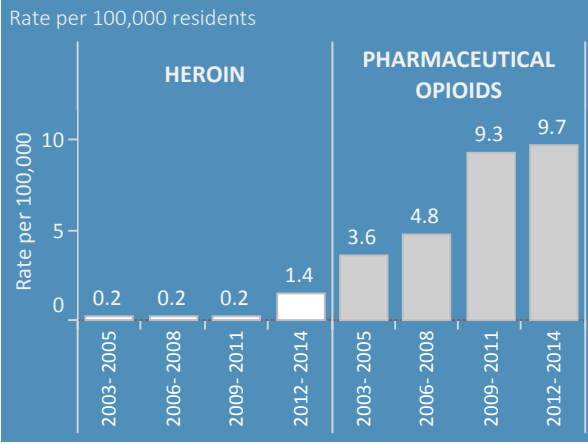

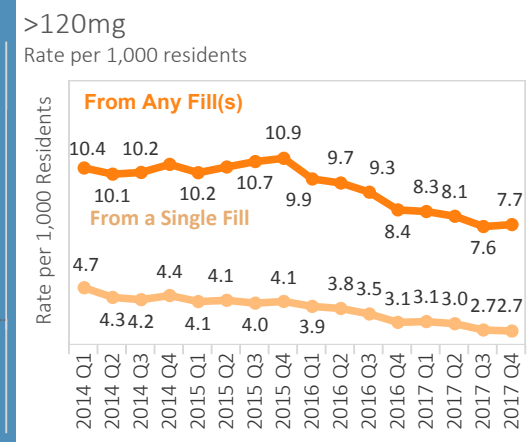
MOST FREQUENTLY PRESCRIBED OPIOID DRUGS, 2016 - 2017 (by Drug Name)



OVERDOSE HOSPITALIZATIONS

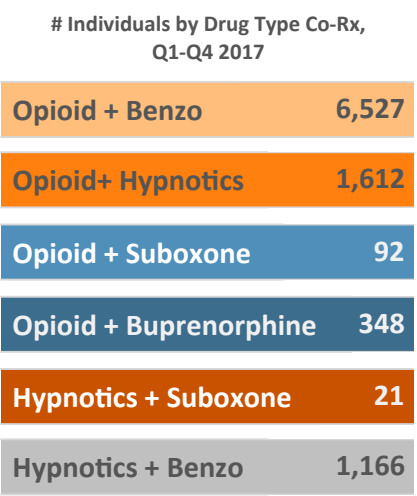


MORPHINE EQUIVALENT DOSING >120mg

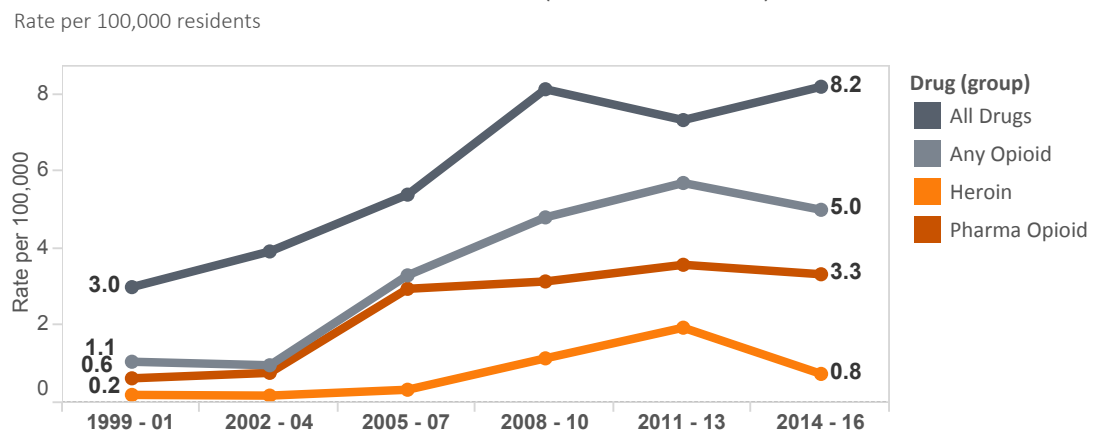


CO-PRESCRIBING
