<p><b>Metrics</b></p> <p>Most common ACEs experienced by 11th graders:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Parents separated or divorced after child was born (47.7%-51.1%)</li> <li>• Lived with a problem-drinker/alcoholic (37.1%-44.4%)</li> <li>• Household member who is/was depressed or mentally ill (38.5%-42%)</li> </ul> <p>Over 35% of Central Oregon Medicaid members report having 4 or more ACEs (compared to 22.5% of the general Oregon population).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 3,000 out of 5,000 children ages 0-3 in Central Oregon have food and housing concerns.</li> <li>- 350 children were in foster care for at least 1 day in 2012</li> <li>- Only 37.3% in Crook, 39.4% in Deschutes, and 25.7% in Jefferson of 3 and 4 year olds were enrolled in early education in 2012.</li> <li>- Crook County has the lowest rate of available childcare providers (10 per 100 children under age 13 in 2013) and the highest rate of child victims abuse or neglect (19.9%)</li> </ul>	<p>- If we improve educational experience, then we can expect to see higher Kindergarten Readiness, school attendance, and high school graduation rates.</p> <p>- If we improve employment, then we expect to see higher attendance and engagement/productivity.</p> <p>- If we improve well-being, then we expect higher health engagement and a decreased prevalence of chronic conditions.</p> <p>- If we build awareness and knowledge, then we expect more organizations and individuals will be committed to the movement, the network will strengthen, more organizations will adopt policies and practices, more employees will feel resilient, supported and competent, and more service recipients achieve positive outcomes in the face of adversity.</p>
